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NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION

The story of Invisible Children began in 2003, when three young filmmakers traveled to East Africa and filmed a documentary, Invisible Children: The Rough Cut, about the ongoing civil war and child soldier phenomenon in northern Uganda. Upon showing this documentary in the United States, the story of the child soldiers sparked a youth-oriented grassroots movement driven by the desire to transform apathy into activism.

This movement led to the establishment of Invisible Children, Inc. (the "Organization") as a registered California 501(c)(3) in 2004. The Organization's programs include educational and microeconomic initiatives in Central Africa benefiting over 11,000 people as well as biannual tours, awareness events, and fundraising campaigns stateside.

Recently, the Organization has expanded its operations to Central Africa to address the plight of the most recent victims of the Lord's Resistance Army's (LRA) reign of terror who live in some of the most remote regions of the world. The Invisible Children Protection Plan is a comprehensive, five-step strategy that takes direct action to ensure stability by 1) building an early warning radio network to facilitate twice daily security broadcast and early warning communications; 2) educating local communities and facilitating safe LRA surrenders; 3) deploying search and rescue teams; 4) providing rehabilitation and family reunification; and 5) promoting the arrest of Joseph Kony and top LRA commanders.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Basis of Presentation - Under accounting standards on Financial Statements of Not-for-profit Organizations, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

Unrestricted Net Assets - Unrestricted amounts consist of assets which are fully available, at the discretion of management and the Board of Directors, for the Organization to utilize in any of its programs or supporting services. Unrestricted net assets also include amounts designated for certain purposes by the Board of Directors.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets - Temporarily restricted amounts are those which are restricted by donors for specific operating purposes and are not currently available for use in the organization's operations until commitments regarding their use have been fulfilled.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

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Permanently Restricted Net Assets - Permanently restricted amounts are those which are restricted by donors that neither expire by the passage of time nor can be fulfilled or removed by the actions of the Organization. At June 30, 2011 and 2010, there were no permanently restricted net assets.

The Organization maintains its cash accounts at three national commercial banks, which at times exceed the federally insured deposit limits. The Organization has not experienced any losses in such accounts and management believes it is not exposed to any significant risk on cash.

Fair Value Measurement - The Organization follows accounting standards consistent with the FASB codification which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and enhances disclosures about fair value measurements for all financial assets and liabilities. The adoption of fair value measurements has no material financial effects on the Organization's financial statements.

Accounts Receivable - Accounts receivable consist of receivables on sales of merchandise.

Pledges Receivable - Pledges receivable consist of unconditional promises to give, which are recorded at the net realizable value at the time the promises are received. All pledges receivable are expected to be collected within one year. Included in pledges receivable are website donations and receivables from a collaboration with Better World Books. Pledges receivable related to website donations that are due to the Organization totaled approximately \$26,000 and \$107,000 as of June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively. Pledges receivable related to the Better World Books collaboration totaled approximately \$21,000 and \$38,000 as of June 30, 2011 and 2010, respectively.

Management assesses the collectability of all accounts and pledges receivable at the close of each period and records an allowance for doubtful accounts based on specific identification. Management has determined all accounts receivable and pledges receivable to be collectible at June 30, 2011 and 2010.

Inventory - Inventory consists of program materials and is valued at lower of cost or market, determined using the first in, first out method. Management has determined the allowance for obsolete inventory to be \$0 at June 30, 2011 and 2010.

Prepaid Expenses - Expense items of a nature which will benefit future periods are charged to the prepaid expense account and are amortized over actual periods benefited.

Property and Equipment - Property and equipment are carried at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method of depreciation over the assets' estimated useful lives of five to seven years. Maintenance and repairs are charged to the expense as incurred; major renewals and betterments are capitalized. When items of property and equipment are sold or retired, the related cost and accumulated depreciation are removed from the accounts, and any gain or loss is included in income.

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NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Support and Revenue Recognition - Support and revenue is recognized when earned, which may be when cash is received, unconditional promises made, in-kind donations received or when products are sold.

Donor Imposed Restrictions - All contributions are considered available for the Organization's general programs unless specifically restricted by the donor. Amounts received that are designated for future periods or restricted by the donor are reported as temporarily or permanently restricted support and increase the respective class of net assets. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor or subject to other legal restrictions.

Donated Services - The Organization recognizes the value of donated services by recording the services at fair value. All donated services recognized must create a non-financial asset or must require specialized skills that would have been purchased if not donated. During the years ending June 30, 2011 and 2010, the Organization had many individuals volunteer substantial time and effort in order to perform a variety of tasks in the United States and Africa to assist the Organization in its mission. However, these services do not meet the criteria for recognition as contributed services.

Production and Film Costs - Costs related to the production of a documentary to raise awareness are being expensed as incurred.

Advertising - The Organization expenses advertising costs as incurred. Advertising expenses for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010 were approximately \$139,000 and \$117,000, respectively.

Functional Expenses - The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Income Taxes - Invisible Children is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and did not conduct unrelated business activities. Therefore, no provision has been made for federal income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

The Organization has adopted accounting standards which clarify the accounting for uncertainty in income taxes recognized in the financial statements and prescribes a recognition threshold and measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of a tax position taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. It also provides guidance on derecognition and measurement of a tax position taken or to be taken in a tax return. The adoption of these standards did not have a material effect on the Organization. As of June 30, 2011, the Organization has not accrued interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Organization files tax returns in the U.S. Federal jurisdiction and the State of California. The Organization is no longer subject to examination by U.S. and California tax authorities for years before 2007 and 2006, respectively.

Throughout the year, the Organization leases residential properties on a month-to-month basis.

Schools 4 Schools campaign consists of funds raised for the purpose of rebuilding schools in Central Africa.

Legacy Fund consists of funds raised to provide scholarships and mentoring programs in Central Africa.

Grants consist of funds primarily received from private foundations and individuals for the purpose specified by the donor.

The Organization experienced very strong and unexpected revenue near fiscal year end 2011, which is reflected in unrestricted net assets at June 30, 2011. As a result of this surge in revenue, the Organization's management is working with the Board of Directors to develop a plan for how the funds can be a catalyst to future program impact as well as helping to assure medium to long term sustainability through the development of a reserve fund.
